BARRY MORRISON COACH'S CORNER



With the blur that was 2020 behind us and the 2021 season fast approaching, we continue to live in uncertain and changing times. Despite the challenges we face as a soccer community across New Brunswick, tremendous work has been done at all levels to ensure soccer continues to operate and we continue to provide fun and rewarding experiences for our players. On the planning side of things, we haven't stopped planning for the future both near and far. For 2021, we are updating some programming and continuing to work on alignment with Canada Soccer Club Licensing. Over the course of 2021 we will update curriculum for our players, work to add increased feedback for players at all levels and continue to update programs to provide exciting, player-centered soccer experiences.

As part of our 2020 and early 2021 work, we have achieved Quality Soccer Provider as part of the Canada Soccer Club Licensing process. In 2021 and 2022 we will be working to complete the Provincial Club level 1 qualification in the same program. As part of our work on this program we will be see the

addition of programs, increases in our educational programs for coaches, parents, administrators and referees. All of this work is geared toward helping us to improve the quality of soccer experience for all of our members.

We have all seen a shift to more work being done online and coaching education is no different. Canada Soccer is now offering opportunities to do much of the course work for a coaching workshop online, with a follow up on-field workshop happening locally here in Fredericton to help you finish up the work you have been doing as coaches to continue your development. As we will be working toward having all coaches educated and developed, we have a full slate of on field, in-person work to support the work coaches will be doing in an online environment through the Canada Soccer platforms.

Online Component: This is expected to be available from Canada Soccer by the middle of April, and coaches will be able to complete the online portion of their workshop on their time from the comfort of their

own home. You can do the content over a number of sessions, or all in one sitting.

In-person Component: To complete all workshops, coaches will need to complete the in-person component part of the workshop here in Fredericton. We will be offering in-person workshops as per the schedule below. Coaches can expect to gain active coaching and practice planning skills, while working with other coaches from across the region.

GPS Workshop: These are for all FDSA coaches in each age group, and are a regular annual update to help coaches gain comfort with the plan for the year, and get ready to work with the players on their team in the coming weeks. All coaches are expected to complete the GPS workshop each year. For coaches who are completing their appropriate soccer coaching certification, they will be able to complete the GPS workshop at the same time, as they are scheduled to overlap in order to minimize the time needed to complete the training and provide a common place for coaches in each age group to interact each year.

COMPETITIVE PROGRAMS:

- **a.** All Premiership players must be registered NO LATER than Mon. April 5th.
- **b.** All Division I players must be registered NO LATER than Friday April 16th.
- c. No on-site registration will be held during competitive try-outs, however online registrations can be completed 24/7 once the registration window opens March 15th.
- **d.** Individuals MUST be registered prior to participating in tryouts.
- **e.** Outdoor turf scheduling for April is weather dependent and subject to change.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Register Early. Registrations submitted AFTER the deadlines outlined will be subject to a \$25 late fee and may need to be placed on a first-come. first-serve wait list.
- b. FINAL Registration Deadline for Micro, Mini and Youth programs: Saturday, May 8th.

- **c.** Premiership Players: Try-outs will run April 10th April 18th.
- **d.** U12&U13 Foundations Players: Try-outs will run April 19th May 2nd.
- **e.** Division I Players: Try-outs will run April 21th May 1st.
- f. Family Rate: Families with 2 or more Competitive players will receive a discount of \$45 per player. Families with 3 or more children in FDSA programs will receive a \$15 discount per child (must reside in same household) Ex. If you have 2 Comp players and 1 Rec player you would receive \$45+\$45+\$15=\$105 total discount. If you have 1 Comp player and 2 Rec players, you will receive \$15+\$15+\$15 = \$45 total discount
- g. NSF Fee: A fee of \$25 will be charged.

The program registration fees are set and approved annually by the Board of Directors. The fees are based on the aim of achieving a balanced operating budget for the coming year. The registration fee includes (where applicable) uniforms, provincial & national player registration fees, insurance, club administrative expenses (office rent, utilities, office equipment & IT, club management/database licensing, banking/merchant fees, legal/accounting fees, staffing related expenses) coaches training and certification, technical coaches, training equipment, field costs, referees, year-end awards, jamborees, league & provincial tournament registration fees, awards gala, national travel fund and more.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- If you register three (3) or more children from the same family in recreational programs, \$15 will be deducted from the registration fee of each child if you register all three (3) children at the same time.
- If you register two (2) or more children from the same family in competitive programs, \$45
 will be deducted from the registration fee of each child if you register both children at the
 same time
- Registrations submitted AFTER the deadlines outlined above will be subject to an additional non-refundable \$25 late fee and may need to be placed on a first-come, first-serve wait list.
- \$25 fee for any NSF cheque.
- Rates shown above INCLUDE all taxes and fees.

Every person involved in soccer in Canada deserves an enjoyable experience with the game, regardless of the role they play, their age, their level of experience or their ability. For young players, an enjoyable experience means that they have access to high-quality programs where they can have fun with their friends, learn new skills and play the game in an appropriate format.

Clubs play an important role in this, as they are the primary providers of the soccer programs where young players experience the game in Canada. Canada Soccer has created the Skills Centre Program to guide clubs towards best principles in player development by taking a nationally coordinated approach to developing young soccer players. Skills Centres provide a challenging, enjoyable environment for players to develop and nurture the skills required to succeed in the game of soccer.

Skills Centre Goals

- **1.** Keep players involved in the game for longer by providing an enjoyable experience
- **2.** Guidelines that ensure delivery of the best possible training environment

3. Develop players by increasing opportunity and access to better training and competition

For young players, an enjoyable experience means that they have access to high-quality programs where they can have fun with their friends, learn new skills and play the game in an appropriate format

Skills Centre Principles

To ensure that a holistic development environment exists for players and coaches, Canada Soccer Skill Centres will be guided by the following principles:

With summer fast approaching, the FDSA is excited to welcome all new and returning Micro soccer players and parents to another great summer of fun and excitement! This season just like the last may be unique, but we look forward to getting kids out on the field no matter what that may look like. With things ever changing due to Covid-19 restrictions, the dates below could change, but rest assured, we will notify you should that happen!

The season is set to begin with children taking the fields for their first outing (once per week) either Monday, June 7th or Tuesday, June 8th. As in past years, sessions cancelled due to inclement weather will be

rescheduled to Wednesdays or Thursdays of the same week, same time, and same location.

Once again, Micro Soccer will be offered on both sides of the river. You (as a Parent) will have the choice of either the night of play or location of play. This will make life much easier for all and make Micro soccer more accessible to families!

PROGRAM INFO 2021 MINI SOCCER



PLAYERS BORN IN 2013 OR 2014 (8U)/PLAYERS BORN IN 2011 OR 2012(10U)

Thank you for your interest in the FDSA Mini program for the 2021 summer season.

The 2020 season introduced our Association to a variety of new challenges with adapting our program under the umbrella of a Global Pandemic. We were very proud of our efforts to continue to provide quality programming last year and are confident that we can continue to offer an enjoyable program this year under any possible restrictions. However, we are hopeful and planning for a return to our traditional programs. If this is your first year within the Mini program, we welcome you and hope that you are looking forward to your time with us. The Mini program is a gender specific level of training that will offer players both skill-based training sessions as well as games that are centered toward building an understanding of rules of play and connecting their learned skills to game play. For those returning, it will be a chance to continue to hone your skills and further develop your knowledge of the game. As in years past, the Mini teams will be divided into two age categories (8U & 10U).

The mini program will operate with two sessions per week; the first will be a skill-based session and the

second a game session. The 8U category will be playing a 5 v 5 system - 4 players and 1 goalkeeper. The 10U teams will play with 7 v 7 format - 6 players and 1 goalkeeper.

8U sessions will be 75 minutes, while the 10U sessions will be 75 & 90 minutes. Both the 8U and 10U will continue playing twice a week at various locations throughout the city, including the artificial turf fields.

The 11-week season gets underway with the first team event scheduled for Monday, June 7th (8U & 10U boys) and Tuesday, June 8th (8U & 10U girls).

The strength of our program lies in our volunteer coaches and field marshals. With the possibility of increased safety regulations again this season, our requirement for coaches and volunteers is greater than ever. 


PHOTO NIGHTS

PROGRAM INFO 2021 YOUTH RECREATION

Welcome to the 2021 youth recreation season!

The 2021 soccer season is fast approaching and plans are underway for another successful summer of soccer. With all of the experience we have from the 2020 COVID-modified programming, we are prepared to offer programs that are safe and in-line with any protocols necessary, helping to ensure another smooth and enjoyable summer of soccer.

The 2021 season is gearing up to be another exciting summer on the pitch! Youth soccer continues to be the fastest growing sport in Canada and the FDSA is proud to be able to provide quality soccer programs to youth players in the greater Fredericton area.

Major highlights for the upcoming season include:

In an effort to balance the number of registrants across all youth age groups, the age classifications will remain as 14U and 18U.

Depending on the number of registrants, these age groups will play 8v8 small-sided games on the artificial turf fields in an effort to create as many

teams as possible (max.15 players/team) for a viable league. 18U may play 11v11 if the registration numbers justify more players on a team.

The team selection will be similar to last year.

Teams will be selected by FDSA staff. Players will be assigned to teams based on their skill level and every effort will be made to ensure each team receives an equal number of players at various skill levels, ensuring a balanced league.

NOTE: For players who are new to FDSA, they will be randomly assigned to teams. There will NOT be any modified games or evaluation prior to the start of the season.

The jamboree marks the end of the soccer season and allows for the distribution of team medals while giving the players and parents a chance to end the program with an exciting and fun tournament-style experience. We are planning to be able to host this fun-filled event in a safe environment, while following any Public Health restrictions that may be in place. The jamboree is scheduled for Saturday August 21st, More details to follows.

FOUNDATIONS U12 & U13 FOUNDATIONS PROGRAM



In 2014 the U12 Enhanced program replaced what had been a U11 Premiership and Division 1 Boys and Girls; and U12 Premiership and Division 1 Boys and Girls. Combining the four teams in each gender, we created balanced boys and girls leagues consisting of roughly 60 players each.

This program has been an excellent foundational program and we have seen a dramatic increase in the interest in competitive soccer at the U12 level based on the Enhanced Program. It has also created a more flexible and inclusive environment and has seen a reduction in the amount of travel and cost of participation.

With the Canada Soccer mandate to move from 11v11 to 9v9 programming, it seems like a great opportunity to grow our Enhanced program and carry the philosophy forward into the U13 age group. We believe that looking at our players from 10-13 as our Competitive Foundations Phase, will help to create a clarity about what the objective is within this programming range and allow us to focus clearly on building teams that are inclusive and balanced, providing all players with more equal opportunities to develop and continue their growth as players.

U12 Foundations – Replaces U12 Enhanced

- Tryout Dates: April 19 May 2
- Season Dates: May 3 August 23rd
- Players Born: 2011, 2010, 2009
- Practices: 2 x/week + Optional Skills Center
- Games: 12-15 game season
- Tournaments: Two tournaments (Wanderers Cup) plus one other.

The U12 teams will continue to play in a locally-based league comprised mostly of FDSA teams but could include teams from Oromocto and Woodstock areas.

U13 Foundations – Replaces U13 Prem and Div 1

- Season Dates: May . August 23rd
- Players Born: 2009, 2008
- Practices: 2 x/week + Optional Academy
- Games: 12-15 game season
- Tournaments: Two tournaments

The U13 teams will shift to a 9v9 format and play in the New Brunswick Soccer League (NBSL) against other clubs around the province.



This program has been an excellent foundational program and we have seen a dramatic increase in the interest in competitive soccer at the U12 level based on the Enhanced Program.

We will host tryouts sessions for our U12 and U13 programs as we do with the rest of our programs. We will have coaches evaluate players based on their performance during these tryouts. If numbers necessitate and developmentally appropriate, players at U12 maybe given the opportunity to play at the U13 level.

2021 DIVISION I SOCCER SEASON



The soccer season is fast approaching and plans are again underway for another successful summer of Division I soccer. As a developmental program for the Premiership teams, this program allows athletes to play at a higher level of competition than recreation. Teams are selected through an open tryout process, beginning April 19. For the summer of 2021, FDSA Division 1 programs will include the newly named Foundations Program (formerly U12 Enhanced) for U12 girls, U12 boys, U13 girls, U13 boys. Additional Division 1 teams are being proposed for U15 Girls, U15 Boys, U18 Girls & U18 Boys age groups.

Foundations teams will play in a locally-based league with games against other FDSA teams and possibly Oromocto and Woodstock. Teams will typically train two times and play one game each week and may compete in two to three tournaments throughout the summer. FDSA plans to field four teams each at U12 Girls and Boys and three teams each at U13 Girls and Boys.

U15 & U18 teams will compete in an interlocking league comprised of South (Saint John/Fundy region) & West (Fredericton, Oromocto, Woodstock) region clubs during the week or weekend. They will train two times per week and play eight to ten league games. Teams may also attend two to three tournaments in New Brunswick or Atlantic Canada during the summer. Teams will also be competing for the right to represent the West Region at the Soccer NB Provincial Championships in late August. FDSA plans to field teams at U15 Girls and Boys & U18 Girls and Boys.

While we have been faced with plenty of challenges over the past year, FDSA is very much looking forward to getting back on the pitch with very competiitive Division 1 teams in 2021. With new and returning players, we are hopeful to return to a more regular and enjoyable season this summer!

2021 REFEREE DEVELOPMENT

Referees are a critical part of our sport. For current players it can provide further activity and understanding on the field, for former players it's a great way to stay involved in the game, for parents who are already at the field with their child it can be a great way to stay in shape. For elite athletes, there are development pathways to reach national levels and beyond for those driven to perform at the highest levels.

For new referees:

Entry Level Referee Clinic: This introductory course is intended for anyone who is just beginning their refereeing career. It focuses on the practical aspects of refereeing for primarily youth (12U – 18U) games.

- The cost of this course is \$65 which also covers referee registration for the season.
- New referees will be provided with whistles and badges.
- Referees are responsible for obtaining their own uniforms and cards, there are purchasing programs available through Soccer NB.
